

**This ordinance shall be known as the
Raisin Township Ordinance # 105-01
(Minor Curfew Ordinance)**

It is the purpose of this ordinance to promote the safety, health and welfare for the general public.

Regulation of minor hours in public

Curfew for Minors. No minor, under the age of seventeen (17) years, shall loiter, idle or congregate in or on any public street, highway, alley, park or other area or place open to the public within Raisin Township between the hours of 12:00 a.m. and 6:00 a.m., except where the minor is accompanied by a parent or guardian or some adult delegated by the parent or guardian to accompany the minor child, or where the minor is upon an errand or other legitimate business directed by the minor's parent or guardian.

Aiding or Abetting Violation. It shall be unlawful for any adult, including but not limited to any parent, guardian or other person having the legal care and custody of any minor child, to aid, abet, allow, permit, or encourage any minor to violate the provisions of "Curfew for Minors".

Penalty. A minor who violates this ordinance shall be fined up to \$ 500.00 for each violation, or any adult who aids or abets violation by a minor shall be guilty of a misdemeanor, punishable by imprisonment for not more than 90 days, or a fine of not more than \$ 500.00, or both, plus Court costs.

Severability. If any section of this Ordinance is held invalid by operation of law or by any tribunal of competent jurisdiction, or if compliance with or enforcement of any section should be ruled invalid by such tribunal, the remainder of the Ordinance shall not be affected thereby.

Headings. The headings used in each section of this Ordinance are for the purpose of identification and are not a substantive part of this Ordinance.

Conflict. In the event that there is a conflict with any other ordinances, this Ordinance shall supersede.

This ordinance shall become effective 30 days after publication.
